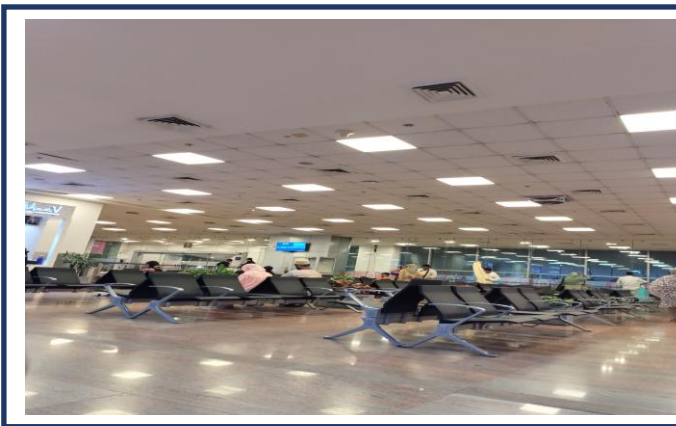

INTRODUCTION OF THE PROGRAM

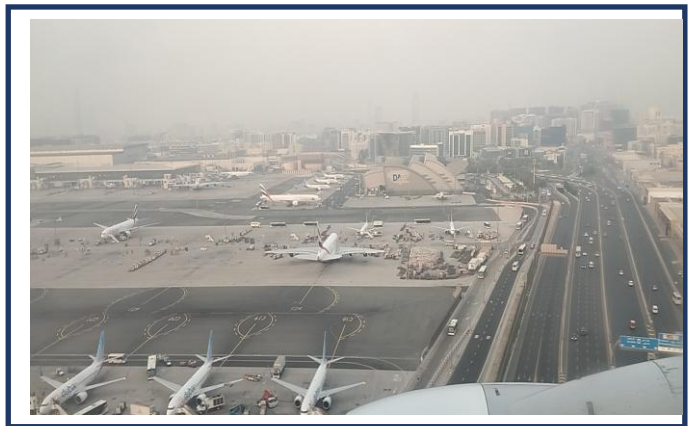

Total 11 students are going for this program. The program duration is of total 27 days where we will study 3 subjects in which we will have to prepare for exams, practical's, assignments, case study, also have 2 industrial visits where is Car manufacturing company (Volkswagen) and Airplane manufacturing company (Airbus).

We also have some excursion visits to Poland which is been scheduled on 4th, 5th & 6th of August. And we will also visit the Berlin city too in the last week of the program.

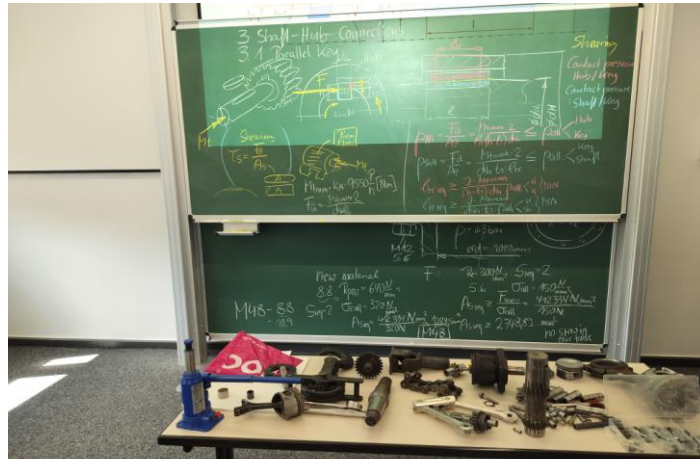
DAY-7 (24/07/2023 – Monday)

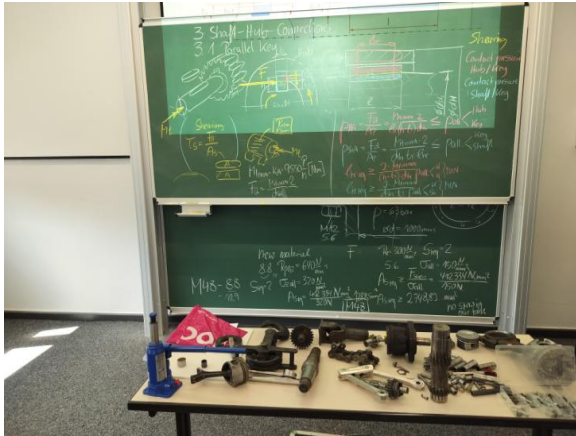

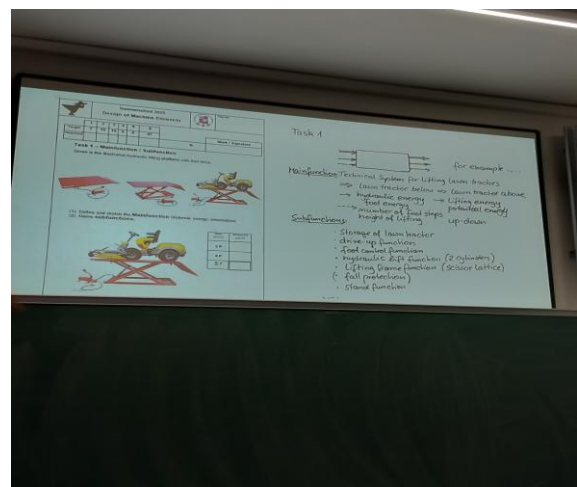

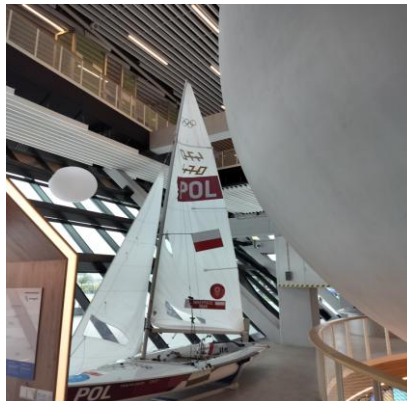
